Mission Statement



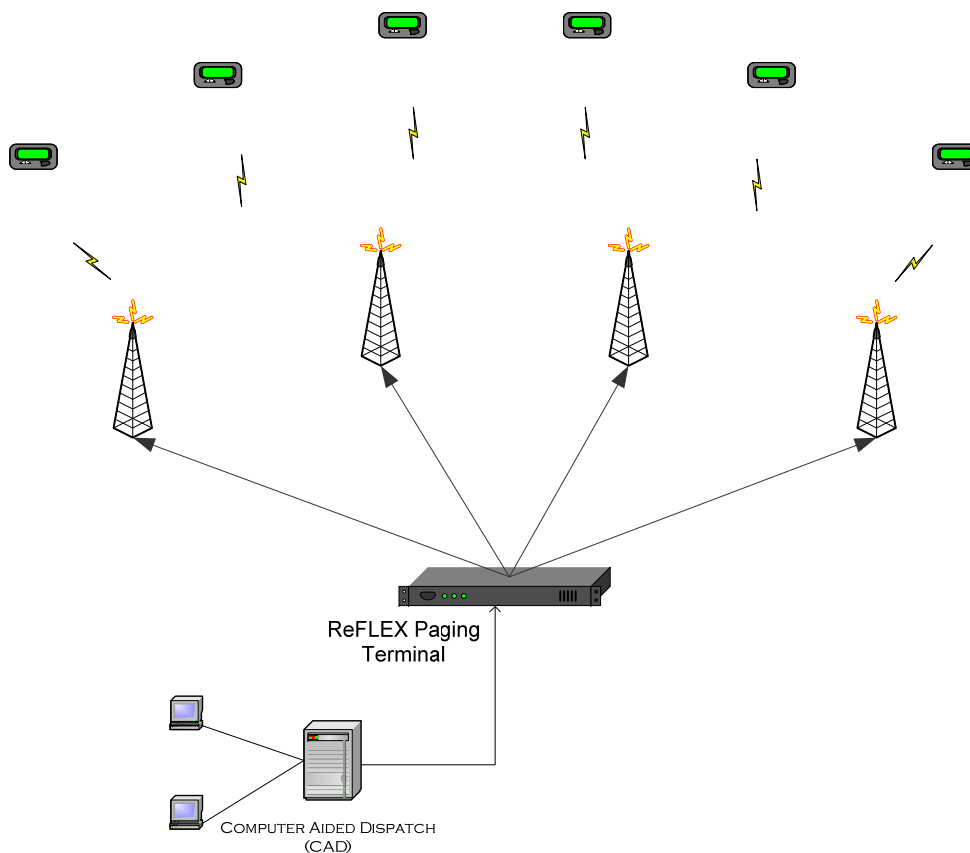

- Seek support for recommended solutions

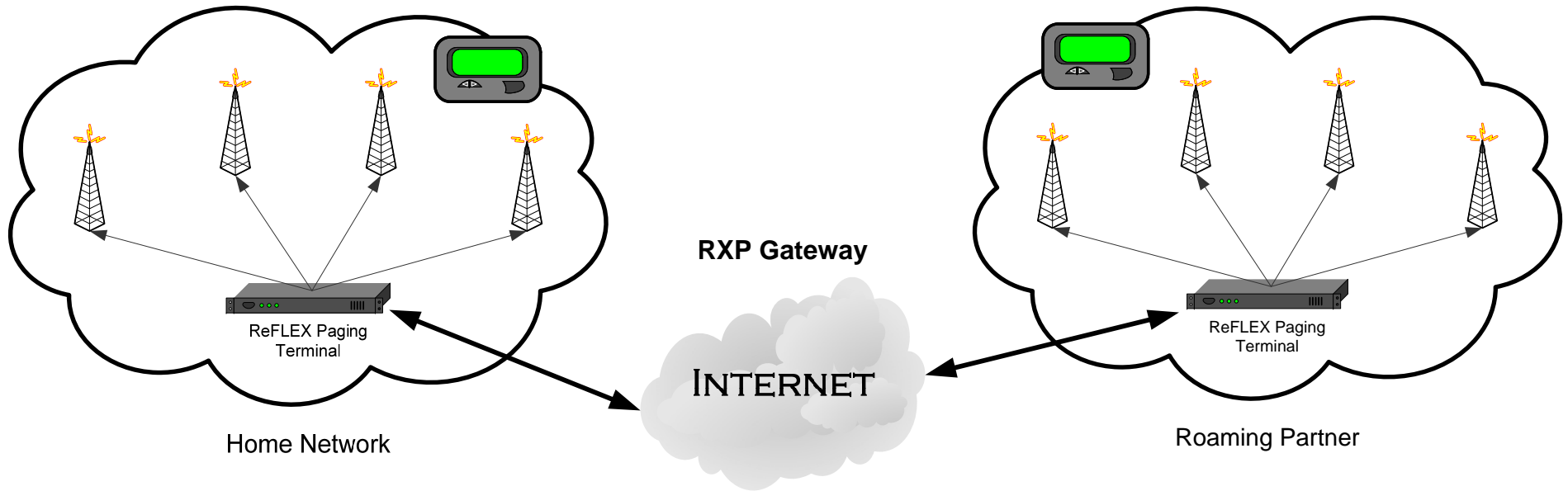
What new capabilities does *two-way paging* offer



All the benefits of one-way plus

- **Message Status Acknowledgement**
 - Message Received
 - Message Read
 - Message Reply
- **OTA Programming**
- **Security – 128bit AES encryption w/OTAR**
- **Low Latency – 5 second delivery**

Network Interoperability

Network Capacity



- System Configuration
- Combination Control/Data Channel
- When network traffic requires additional capacity, add additional data channels on the network

Two-way Paging



- Utilizes FCC Part-24 Narrowband PCS
 - 3-Megahertz total
 - Receive 901-902
 - Transmit 930-931 & 940-941
- Spectrum sold at auction
- All spectrum is currently licensed
- Only small number of channels currently utilized
- NPSTC met with Commission to discuss options

900MHz N-PCS Alerting Draft Band Plan – Action Items



- 8 Nationwide Control Channels
 - 4-930MHz Control channels
 - 4-940MHz Control channels
- 901-902 Receive Channels
 - Develop frequency reuse plan
- Additional spectrum for capacity
- Spectrum management
 - Use regional planning committees
 - Individual licensing
 - Other options ?
- Develop interoperability policies
- Review USA Mobility letter
